## INTRODUCTION

Supporters Direct Scotland, in association with the Scottish Football Association, conducted the National Football Survey, a survey that offered fans a say on a range of issues affecting Scotland's national game.

The survey aimed to engage supporters by gathering vital information on the game's key consumers, its supporters. Topics such as the match day experience, national team performance, regulation and governance were all covered.

Some findings from the survey have been used within more focused research which made up a

book of papers from Supporters Direct Scotland.

www.scottishfans.org/research. The findings of these were published and promoted by media outlets including the Daily Record, FC Business, the Scotsman and were also discussed at First Minister's questions.

## **METHODOLOGY**

The survey was available to complete online between the 2nd and 27th of April. It was made available and distributed through the Supporters Direct Scotland database and shared across multiple social media platforms. Each Scottish Professional Football League team was asked to share details of the survey on their website and via their respective Twitter and Facebook feeds. In total, 3,067 survey responses were gathered.

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Responses from the Supporters Direct Scotland 2014 National Football Survey produced some insightful findings.

The survey revealed that almost 62% of Scottish football fans were in favour of lifting the alcohol ban in Scottish football. A vast majority of participants (72.40%) were in favour of the introduction of a small scale trial.

Nearly 91% of participants were in favour of seeing safe-standing areas being introduced. Of those who don't attend games regularly, almost half (48.79%) claimed they would be more likely to attend games if they had the choice to stand.

And as the momentum continues to build towards greater fan representation at the highest levels of the game, over 93% believe supporters should be represented in their club's boardroom. Similarly, there is a strong belief that the fan ownership model can work in Scotland, with over 91% holding this opinion.

14% of participants were 'very' worried about the issue of match fixing, although 56% were either 'not very' worried or 'not at all' worried. 65% believed players should not be allowed to bet on matches.


The survey also showed that 61% believe a change of season to March to November would benefit the recreational game and 56.5% are confident that the National Team will qualify for Euro 2016.

While participants were strongly of the opinion that Scottish football does not have a problem with racism or homophobia, 84% believed the game still has a problem with sectarianism.




#### Gender




#### Age






#### Will Scotland qualify for Euro 2016?








